

ITEM NO. 25.6: Discussion on the fee structure for the July-December 2022 session

In July-December, 2022 academic session, classes will be conducted both offline and online mode for different semester students according to the situation and instruction of SOPs by the Ministry of Education, Govt. of India.

Taking into consideration of the above, the Senate approved the proposal to charge fees as was being charged during COVID-19 pandemic restriction and lockdown for those students whose classes will be conducted online. For those students whose classes will be conducted offline, the Senate approved the proposal to charge the fees as was being charged before COVID-19 pandemic as per the institute Fee Structures

ITEM NO. 25.7: To ratify the conduct of State of the Art Seminar (SOAS) of Mr. Milner Paul V. (Enrolment No. 19404004), a Ph.D scholar of Electrical Engineering Department

ITEM NO. 25.8: To consider and approve the rules and procedure for PhD Admission –July-2022

The Senate suggested same composition of Committee for both GATE and NON GATE candidates. Preference may be given to GATE qualified candidates. The Senate approved the following rules and procedure for PhD Admission, with effective from July-2022

1. Relaxation in % of marks/CPI/CGPA of minimum qualification

In the qualifying degree for the admission to Ph.D. programme, the minimum CPI/CGPA/ marks percentage shall be relaxed by 0.5 CPI/GCPA or 5 percent in case of candidates belonging to the SC/ ST/ OBC(NCL) /PwD categories.

2. There will not be any upper age limit in the PhD admission at NIT Manipur as the case in other institutes.

3. Application for PhD, admission will be submitted in online mode only.

4. The application fee for the Ph.D. application fee for July 2022 session will be Rs. 500 for Gen/OBC and Rs. 250 for SC/ST/EWS/PwD.

5. Process for PhD admission

(a) Every HOD will provide the details of vacant PhD seats for UR, SC, ST, OBC (NCL), EWS, PwD in their department in every semester.


(b) Government of India rules for reservation of seats for SC, ST, OBC (NCL), EWS, PWD candidates will be followed.

(c) Phd Entrance test and interview will be conducted for non-GATE and non-NET candidates. Only interview will be conducted for GATE and NET qualified candidates.

(d) For Phd Entrance test, the total number of MCQ questions will be 50. Each right question will carry one mark. There will be four options and the total duration the examination will be one hour and 30 minutes. There will be no negative marking for wrong answer.

(e) The minimum qualifying marks in the entrance test will be 50% for UR and 45% for /SC/ ST/ OBC (NCL)/PwD categories.







- (f) List of candidates qualified in the entrance test will be uploaded on institute website.
- (g) The departmental head will constitute a five-member committee, for the Interview of GATE/ NET qualified candidates and candidates qualified in PhD entrance test. Each member of committee will assess the performance of candidate based on 10 marks. Total assessment will be for 50 marks.
- (h) One overall merit list (UR/OPEN). One merit list for EWS, one merit list for OBC candidates (NCL), One merit list for SC candidates, one merit list for PWD candidates and one merit list for ST candidates will be prepared. Vacant seats in each category will be filled in the order of merit from that category, if any EWS, OBC (NCL), SC, ST candidate is having higher merit in overall merit list. He/she will get seat from there.

Senate directed that the papers published in journals indexed in Google Scholar are not acceptable. The International Conference papers published in proceedings of Science Direct/Springer/ASME/IEEE/Web of Science/Scopus Index will only be accepted.

ITEM NO. 25.11: To consider for ex-post facto approval for the subject name, code and credit in the Course work Exam report of some PhD students of Humanities and Social Sciences department

There were some variations in the names and credit of the subjects which were approved in the 2nd Senate meeting held on 31/10/2013 and the subjects printed on the course work exam report of some PhD students of Humanities and Social Sciences department. 
