<p>Part-A: General Aptitude & Reasoning: It would include questions of non-verbal type. The test will include questions on similarities and differences, problem solving, analysis, judgment, decision making, relationship concepts, arithmetical number series, non-verbal series. The test will also include questions designed to test the candidate's abilities to deal with abstract ideas and symbols and their relationship, arithmetical computation and other analytical functions.</p> <p>Part-B: General Knowledge: Questions will be designed to test the ability of the candidate's general awareness of the environment around him and its application to society. Questions will also be designed to test knowledge of current events and of such matters of everyday observation and experience in their scientific aspects as may be expected of an educated person. The test will include questions relating to National Institute of Technology Manipur and Manipur especially pertaining to Sports, History, Culture, Geography, Economic scene and General Polity. These questions will be such that they do not require a special study of any discipline.</p> <p>Part C: General English: Candidates' understanding of the Basics of English Language, its vocabulary, grammar, sentence structure.</p>	<p>Paper II is a Trade Test/Skill test with Knowledge of Basic Computer Applications (Word Processing, Spread Sheet etc.).</p>

Paper-I consists of 3 Parts. Part-A consists of 30, Part-B consists of 30 and Part-C consists of 40 multiple choice questions. One (1) mark will be awarded for each correct answer and minus one fourth (-1/4) mark awarded for the each incorrect answer. The unanswered questions will not attract negative marks. Paper II is of qualifying in nature. and is based on Paper I syllabus only. Compensatory time for persons with Benchmark Disabilities (Divyangjan) will be provided as per the extant orders of Government of India.
